The holidays are a magical time for young children to explore. Homes are filled with items that can be gathered together for children to investigate. Below is an easy idea to encourage safe play with exciting objects in the home.

Create a sensory bin

A sensory bin is a container that holds items that children can safely explore with their

senses.

- Seeing
- Hearing
- Touch
- Smelling
- Taste



Items to add:

- Box (of any kind)
- Clean empty plastic bottles or cans
- Soft stockings or socks
- Shiny ribbon or bows
- Jingle bells (Place them inside a small bottle and seal the lid to prevent choking)
- Empty spice or flavor containers (vanilla, peppermint, nutmeg, cinnamon)

*Tip- add a few drops of scented oil or seasoning to a cotton ball and place in a plastic bottle for children to smell!
