Parent Education Family First and Parent Club

Lilly Moody, Program Director at the Shelter Home of Caldwell County, attended the Family First and Parent Club meeting. She discussed domestic violence, the different forms of domestic violence and how it impacts children. Parents had the opportunity to discuss and ask questions.
